

Walks in the Woodbridge Wild

Oros Wildlife Preserve - Omar Avenue, Avenel NJ

Naturalist Walk: June 29th at 10am (rain date June 30th)

The Oros Wildlife Preserve contains ponds, wetlands, forest, fields, and a butterfly garden, which provide habitat for a myriad of plant and wildlife species. Come explore the Preserve and learn about the diversity of life living right in the middle of a highly –urbanized landscape!

Bat Walk: July 13th at 8pm (rain date July 14th) And August 10th at 7:30 (rain date August 11th)

9 species of bats call New Jersey home, and many can be seen flying around your neighborhood at dusk. Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve as the light fades to watch bats hunt insects using echolocation, and learn about their unique ecology! You will learn how to use an acoustic monitor that can detect what bat species are flying nearby. Please bring a headlamp or flashlight.

Bird Walk: July 27th at 8am (rain date July 28th)

Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve for a guided bird walk to see (and hear) birds in a variety of habitats. The preserve is a birding hot spot, with 179 species reported on ebird.com. Birders of all levels are welcome and encouraged to attend! Binoculars will be provided.
