COVID-19_TV-35 MESSAGE
MONDAY, JUNE 29, 2020



This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Monday, June 29.

There is very good news to report in the Township for this weekend. No, I did not save 15% on my car insurance by switching to GEICO. The number of new cases of Coronavirus in Woodbridge was only five for the whole weekend with three on Friday, two on Saturday and zero on Sunday.

We had only 20 new cases last week from Monday through Sunday.

We have not seen numbers this low since the very first week we started reporting cases back in mid- March. We first hit double figures in new cases with 17 on March 26 and had plenty of days with caseloads in the 60s, 70s and even 80s so these recent numbers are very welcome news.

There were 16 new cases in State facilities and none in health care facilities over the weekend.

Sadly the bad news is that there are two additional deaths to report from a week ago – a 59 year old male and an 81 year old male.

Please remember to keep all those who passed and everyone who just got sick or who is still sick in your thoughts and prayers.

The outside gathering limit is expected to increase on July 6 and our summer concert series will begin that night. On Thursday limited inside dining will be allowed with many restrictions and our web site and social media pages have that information also. Our Health Department visited 45 sites so far to make sure they are reopening with the safety of their employees and customers in mind.

Woodbridge Center opened today which is great news.

We are going to continue our crackdown on loud mufflers and we have issued hundreds of violations for those and other infractions we notice. We are also cracking down on fireworks but we need the help of the public to anonymously report addresses where they are being set off by calling the Police non-emergency number of 732 634 7700. We will have extra patrols through the weekend.

Please continue to follow the personal hygiene guidelines and please continue to check on your neighbors.
