COVID-19_TV-35 MESSAGE
MONDAY, AUGUST 10, 2020



This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Monday, August 10.

The weekend started out well with four new cases of general public Coronavirus reported in the Township on Friday and only one on Saturday but then this morning's report showed nine new cases on Sunday.

The Township has not had more than five cases in a single day since July 14. Two addresses this weekend had multiple cases with both a parent and child impacted and both children were only 10. The average age of the 14 new cases was 38.

We are still averaging only 3 ½ cases per day of Covid19 in July and August. Another interesting statistic is that we hit the halfway point of the current count of general public cases on April 22. This means that in the first five weeks of reporting we had as many cases as in the last 15 weeks. That's a very good sign that the curve has been flattened in Woodbridge and it is right in line with the State of New Jersey and County of Middlesex.

State facilities reported three new cases and there were none in health care facilities and thankfully no new deaths to report.

Let's keep the progress going by practicing social distancing, good personal hygiene and the wearing of masks particularly while indoors. Always check on your neighbors.



Our concert series continues with shows every Sunday through Thursday at Woodbridge High School with 10 foot boxes painted four feet apart to allow for social distancing.

There is a special show this Friday at 6:00 PM featuring Cosmic, a Grateful Dead cover band. There is a \$15 cover charge and all proceeds go to Road to Hope, a group that provides programs, services and housing to those in recovery. It is an amazing group of people and a wonderful cause and the show is tremendous.



This Saturday from 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM in the Town Hall parking lot will be our Weekly Farmer’s Market plus an Earth Day celebration with many attractions and tables. Parking is available across the street and in the train station lots.

Our September 11 annual Remembrance Ceremony this year will also honor those Woodbridge residents who passed in the last several months from Covid19 or from any other cause who did not have a proper farewell wake or funeral.
