This is Woodbridge Mayor John McCormac and today is Friday, October 16.

The Township numbers continue to stay high with 33 new general public cases of Coronavirus over the last three days with 16 on Tuesday, eight on Wednesday and nine on Thursday. There were no new cases in outside facilities and once again, no new deaths to report.

The last day we had over 16 cases was May 2 and our 76 cases in the last seven days is our highest since that first week in May. October is already higher than the months of July and August and at the rate we are going it will surpass June and September.

The good news is that there are only three cases this month that required hospitalization and everyone recently has recovered or is recovering.

We are changing gears on the virtual Veteran's Parade since we really do not have many living Woodbridge residents who fought in World War II other than those in the Veteran's home where visitations are strictly limited.

Instead, we will collect pictures and short biographies of anyone who fought in World War II while a resident of Woodbridge now living or deceased and include them in a video on Veteran's Day that includes clips of prior parades.
