

Walks in the Woodbridge Wild

Oros Wildlife Preserve - Omar Avenue, Avenel NJ

Plants – June 10th at 10:00 a.m. (rain date June 11th)

Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve and discover a lush natural area in between Route 9 and the Jersey Turnpike. Explore the wetland and upland plant communities and learn to identify native and non-native plant species. Hear about how these plants provide important resources for wildlife and make this area a birding hot spot within a highly urbanized landscape.

Reptile Amphibian Walk – June 24th at 10:00 a.m.

(rain date June 25th)

Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve for a guided reptile and amphibian walk and learn about common species you can find right here in New Jersey! In addition to some local New Jersey critters, you will get to see, hold, and learn about some exotic species from Brazil, Australia, and Asia!

Bat Walk – July 8th (rain date July 9th)

& July 22nd (rain date July 23rd) at 7:30 p.m.

9 species of bats call New Jersey home, and many can be seen flying around your neighborhood at dusk. Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve as the light fades to watch bats hunt insects using echolocation, and learn about their unique ecology! You will learn how to use an acoustic monitor that can detect what bat species are flying nearby.

Bird Walk – August 26th at 7:30 a.m. (rain date August 27th)

Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve for a guided bird walk to see (and hear) birds in a variety of habitats. The preserve is a birding hot spot, with over 160 species reported on ebird.com. Birders of all levels are welcome and encouraged to attend! Binoculars will be provided.
