**2ND Annual Central Jersey Beer Fest Joins Farmer's Market & St.
James Street Fair on Sat., Sept. 20**

The Woodbridge Farmers' Market... St. James Street Fair... and the 2nd Annual Central Jersey Charity Beer Fest... are the centerpiece of "Super Saturday" on Main Street in Downtown Woodbridge. The day-long market, fair and Oktoberfest gets underway this Saturday - Sept. 20 - from 8:00 a.m. – until 5:00 p.m.

Farmers' Market vendors continue to offer the finest "Jersey Fresh" produce - fall fruits and vegetables including squash, pumpkins, apples, sweet corn and tomatoes, along with home-made pies, breads and other specialty food items. The Farmers Market is located in the Town Hall parking lot at the foot of Main Street.

Taste New Jersey's finest local handcrafted microbrews and beer at the 2nd Annual Charity Beer Fest. J.J. Bittings Brewing Co. of Woodbridge sponsors the festival which sets-up on the lawn at Parker Press Park in downtown Woodbridge. Beer Fest 2008 will be bigger and better than last year, with more New Jersey breweries displaying and offering specialty brews, live music and food vendors. Attendees are encouraged to bring lawn chairs for their own convenience. Gates open at 1:00 p.m. and the last pour will be at 5:00 p.m. Admission for the festival is \$20 for adult samplers and \$10 for non-drinkers. Those wishing to sample the many micro-brews must provide identification and proof of legal drinking age. Admission includes a two ounce official Beer Fest sampler glass and free parking. Proceeds from Beer Fest 2008 will be donated to Kelly Mahon, a young Woodbridge resident who recently suffered a stroke, to assist her family in building a handicap ramp for her house. In case of inclement weather, Beer Fest will be rescheduled for Sat., Sept. 27, 2008.
