The accomplishment numbers reported below are taken from an evaluation of each individual activity completed during the 2022 Program Year rather than from the PR-23 report, which is often inaccurate.

Accomplishments indicate a healthy program that is providing important benefits to a large number of Woodbridge residents. This is particularly true in the areas of public facilities that serve low-mod income areas and public services that benefit low-mod clientele. Significant funds were spent on the continuing Olsen Towers project, specifically the acquisition of the property. Additional funds will be spent on this project in the 2023 program year.

In 2020 Woodbridge received CDBG-CV funds. The Township continues to spend these funds. During 2022, a significant amount of CV money allocated to the Perth Amboy YMCA Shelter were drawdown. This activity benefited 81 people.

**Narrative**

For the 2022 Program Year, Woodbridge Township received a CDBG allocation of \$675,200.00. The program also received \$82,375.10 in program income and there was \$1,020,183.54 in unexpended prior year funds available for a total of \$1,777,758.64 in CDBG resources available in 2022. Woodbridge spent \$745,335.75 in 2022, the majority of which was for an acquisition project for 75 new units of affordable housing through the Housing Authority.

The Township received \$1,208,457 in CDBD-CV Funds, to date they have spent \$318,173.62.

The Township leverages federal funding through its own local resources and encourages service providers to seek private funding for social services as well. With the exception of housing rehab, Woodbridge CDBG funds do not serve as the sole source of funding for any of its recipients/partners. All of the social service providers have various streams of funding available to them and in many cases the funding received from the CDBG program represents a small portion of their overall budget.

Publicly owned land or property located within the jurisdiction used to address the needs identified in the plan consisted of the public park, Milos Park, that was improved with CDBG funds.

## **CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)**

**Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:**

### **Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs**

The Middlesex County Board of Social Services and the Office of Human Services provide counseling programs for homeless persons and emergency assistance. The Comprehensive Emergency Assistance System (CEAS) Committee coordinates homeless strategies and programs countywide. Outreach efforts include the annual Point in Time survey.

Outreach also occurs on both a formal and informal basis at homeless shelters, such as the Ozanam Family Homeless Shelter, which the Township supports with CDBG funds. As front-line providers of homeless shelter and services, shelter staff accumulate insight into the homeless population's needs and challenges. Shelter staff, in turn, help formulate the Township's CDBG plans and help implement those plans.

### **Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons**

As noted above, during the 2022 Program Year, the Township supported the Ozanam Family homeless shelter, located in nearby Edison Township. Specifically, the Township provided \$20,000 in operating funds to help the shelter house and support 18 residents. The Township also gave \$10,000 of CDBG funds to the Perth Amboy Raritan Bay YMCA Shelter, for programs that give support to the homeless or those at risk of being displaced. In addition, Woodbridge spent \$451,000 in 2021 to acquire a property that will house homeless and the housing insecure population.

### **Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs**

The Township is active in countywide planning and implementation to head off homelessness for those most at risk, including populations being discharged from public institutions and systems.

Additionally, the housing rehab projects completed by the Township program help combat homelessness by allowing residents with mobility challenges to remain in their homes.

### **Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families**

**with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again**

\* By supporting the Ozanam Family homeless shelter, and Perth Amboy Raritan Bay YMCA Shelter, where case management and needs assessments encourage clients to identify and address the issues that caused their homelessness and assists in making the links and taking the steps to accomplish that goal;

\* By participating in the County Continuum of Care and other joint efforts at addressing homelessness, transition and permanency.

## **CR-30 - Public Housing 91.220(h); 91.320(j)**

### **Actions taken to address the needs of public housing**

CDBG funds were used for acquisition and site development costs for construction of 75 affordable Housing Authority Units. Project is the Olsen Towers Housing Authority units - consisting of 75 affordable rentals which will be located at 537 New Brunswick Avenue.

Both the Township and the Woodbridge Housing Authority coordinate their efforts and activities to ensure adequate and efficient service in the areas of public housing and housing assistance.

### **Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership**

The Woodbridge Housing Authority has established residents' councils in each public housing project. These councils assist in making decisions regarding priority needs and funding to be allocated to facilitate projects.

### **Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs**

The Woodbridge Housing Authority is not a troubled PHA.

**Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)**

In the development of the 2020-24 Consolidated Plan and 2022 Action Plan, the Township evaluated significant public policies affecting affordable housing development such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges and growth limitations. Based on this evaluation, the Township determined that it has taken all necessary steps to ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that may have been a barrier to affordable housing. Moreover, the Township is actively engaged with the development of their Affordable Housing Plan for submittal to the New Jersey Courts.

### **Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The primary obstacle to meeting underserved needs is a lack of funds. There are many needs in all of the areas - public facilities, public services, infra-structure, and economic development – and municipal resources go only so far.

The Township, through both staff and consultants, is constantly looking for additional funding sources to address the unmet needs identified in our community. We routinely attract state, federal, regional and private funding for improvements and services that aide the community at large and lower income neighborhoods and residents in particular.

The development of more and better jobs for low and moderate income persons would help reduce the scale or scope of needs as well. In this vein, the Township undertakes economic development projects to attract and retain employers and works with local and regional job training entities to enhance residents' work skills.

### **Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Township had no activities in 2022 specifically designed to reduce lead-based paint hazards. The residential rehab program consists solely of the installation of accessibility ramps, a process that does not disturb any painted surfaces.

### **Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Township views its activities to address affordable housing, prevent homelessness and to improve the economic prospects of its low-income residents as a part of a comprehensive effort to reduce the level of poverty in Woodbridge. The Township supports programs and activities that promote a stable

and growing economy. Business assistance loans and guarantees are available to firms that wish to expand. In return for below market rate loans and support these firms pledge to create jobs for low and moderate-income persons. Many of these loans are to small and very small firms that offer growth potential for the community and the region.

The Township's anti-poverty strategy is inextricably linked to the Economic Programs that have been implemented and operated for several years. The objective of poverty reduction requires programming for broad areas, including job training and placement, public services, education and basic skills development. The overriding principle however is to create new jobs and opportunities for households with incomes below the poverty level. It is only through comprehensive, coordinated strategies that nurture skills and provide opportunities to gain and retain employment and thus improve the quality of life that people can improve their situation.

It is essential to provide the basic skills, training and education necessary to make a person employable in today's competitive job market. The Township works with the Board of Education to assist persons obtain high school diplomas or the GED certificate. The Township facilitates and supports programs to coordinate training programs provided by public institutions with the needs of employers.

However, other education and training programs contribute to achieving the objective of reducing poverty. Examples of these include job training and job placement activities sponsored by the Workforce Investment Board, and the Division of Social Work Services, the Welfare to Work Program, day care funding throughout the Township, long-term employment opportunities for severely disabled adults and life skills development programs. The Middlesex County Vocational and Technical Schools, the Middlesex County College and the Continuing Education Program also provide important training and educational opportunities for local residents.

Since 1975, the Township has been providing financial assistance through direct grants as well as technical and advisory assistance to non-profits and community agencies that administer a wide variety of programs for lower income residents. These programs have an immediate impact on primary needs of the low-income population and the causes of poverty. CDBG provides the core funding for critical basic needs including elderly care, housing counseling and the Food Bank.

### **Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Township Council, through the Department of Planning and Development, has the ultimate responsibility in assuring that the priority needs of the Consolidated Plan are met. The Department provides the funding and technical assistance to the non-profit housing developers and service providers and Township agencies and authorities for projects that meet the needs documented in the plan.

The Township's housing and community development programs are administered by the Department of Planning and Development, working with a number of other Township agencies, county offices and not-for-profit service providers. The Township is also a member of the Middlesex County Home Consortium.

Both the Township and the Woodbridge Housing Authority, coordinate their efforts and activities to ensure adequate and efficient service in the areas of public housing and housing assistance. The Housing Authority manages the Section 8 program on a day-to-day basis.

**Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)**

The Township maintains a close relationship with State and County organizations that provide assistance to low and moderate income persons as well as the homeless.

The Comprehensive Emergency Assistance System (CEAS) Committee coordinates homeless strategies and programs countywide. Though various regional entities and the CEAS work well together, there are opportunities for improved coordination and communication. During 2022, all agencies involved in these efforts continued to seek new ways to better serve their target populations and the general public.

The Department of Planning and Development has established procedures to ensure coordination with the relevant Township Departments, including Finance, Engineering, and Public Works.

Again in 2022, the Township maintained a very close relationship with the Middlesex County CDBG Program. Efforts are also coordinated with the programs in other municipalities on specific issues. The Township has worked closely with local non-profit organizations to actively encourage housing programs for low- and moderate-income persons. Also, the Township Department of Planning and Development maintains a positive relationship with the builders, developers, and financial institutions in the County and the region. This collaborative approach has assisted in the creation of affordable housing projects.

Inadequacies in the institutional structure are primarily related to the lack of adequate funding to address local needs.

**Identify actions taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified in the jurisdictions analysis of impediments to fair housing choice. 91.520(a)**

No major impediments regarding fair housing or affordable housing that require action by the Township have been identified. The Township is aware of rising housing costs in the community and continues to fund its housing and economic development programs, assisting low income households to cope with these rising costs. The Township will continue to make certain its public policies are not discriminatory and consider policies in light of their impacts on housing affordability.

The Township's Community Development Program standards and procedures for compliance monitoring are designed to ensure that:

- 1) objectives of the National Affordable Housing Act are met,
- 2) program activities are progressing in compliance with the specifications and schedule for each program, and
- 3) recipients are in compliance with other applicable laws, implementing regulations, and with the requirements to affirmatively further fair housing and minimize displacement of low-income households.

The CD Program continued to carryout monitoring activities and internal audits to ensure that it complies with all CDBG program requirements. The Program has followed the procedures and requirements published by HUD. The Township worked closely with particular entities in the execution and monitoring of the programs described in the Action Plan

Action Plan activities were monitored through the use of checklists and forms to facilitate uniform monitoring.

Fiscal monitoring included review and approval of budgets, compliance with Grant Agreements, approval of vouchers and reviews of fiscal reports and sub-recipient audits.

Monitoring of sub-recipients occurred through regular telephone and on-site monitoring visits.

**Minority Business Outreach** - The Township encourages participation by minority-owned businesses in CDBG assisted activities and maintains records concerning the participation of minority-owned businesses to assess the results of its efforts and to complete the semiannual "Minority Business Enterprise Report" to HUD. Qualified minority contractor are encouraged to bid on properties participating in the Housing Rehabilitation Program.

## **Citizen Participation Plan 91.105(d); 91.115(d)**

**Describe the efforts to provide citizens with reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment on performance reports.**

Woodbridge Township will be placing the CAPER document on public display for a period of the required 15 days, from September 13, 2023 through September 27, 2023. Copies will be placed in the Community Development Office at the Municipal Building. The public was notified of the public comment period by an advertisement which appeared in the local publication *The Home News Tribune*. A copy of the advertisement is provided with this report.

These efforts to provide reasonable notice and an opportunity to comment were extended to all residents, including minorities, non-English speaking persons and persons with disabilities in the following ways:

- The facility where the draft copy of the report was available to the public is fully accessible;
- The public notice was printed in the local newspaper of general circulation, which is available to all residents;
- The Township does not have a sufficiently large non-English speaking population to require publication in another language. However, the Township still includes limited English residents by having staff and community volunteers available to translate for those persons who need that service.

The Township will continue to seek community partners capable of assisting in those efforts.

While always aware of opportunities to improve, the Township believes that the overall direction and implementation of its CDBG program meet both the requirements of the federal government and the needs of our local residents

2022	<p>RBAYMCA identified the need to increase mental/behavioral health services to the community as a top unmet and growing need across all populations. As a result of the funding received, we have made great strides in bridging the gap that exists in this area.</p> <p>The Y was able to hire a Director of Counseling and Social Services with an MSW and more than 5 years experience. She began the process of application to the State of NJ for an Outpatient license. Obtaining this license will allow the Y to deliver much needed direct counseling services to individuals/couples/ families struggling with a wide spectrum of challenges. Often, there are weeks to months waiting lists for such services. During the waiting time, many clients experience a worsening of symptoms. Being able to quickly deliver needed assistance, will help in decreasing symptom exacerbation and contribute to better long-term outcomes. In order to ensure we were operating from solid research on the need for mental health services, and receive expert guidance on the licensure process, we contracted with Clinical Management Consultants to do a pre application study. As expected, the study concluded the need way high and expected to climb. The application process is lengthy and ongoing.</p> <p>Additionally, the VP of Social Responsibility continued to increase local networks already working in the MH space, including increased collaboration with the Middlesex County Coordinated Family Care organization. This agency is contracted with the State to provide referrals to MH agencies for counseling to children and families who are involved in the NJ Children System of Care. The YMCA has been able to strengthen its ties to this important referral source and provide vital counseling services to children and families. Through additional networking strategies, the Dir. Of Counseling was successful in being appointed to the Middlesex County Mental Health Board. There, she is able to raise the profile of the Y as a provider of MH services, and give valuable input on current and pending County policy and service delivery.</p> <p>As a result of this funding, we were able to significantly increase internal capacity through training opportunities both internally and with other outside agencies. Three YMCA employees received trainer certification in both Teen Mental Health First Aid, and Youth Mental Health First Aid.
