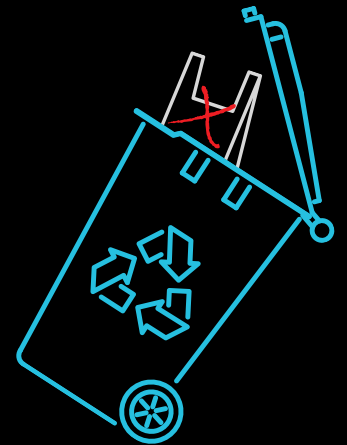

Message From Mayor John E. McCormac



Greetings To Woodbridge Township Residents:

We are pleased to present the 2024 Woodbridge Township Sanitation & Recycling calendar!!!

This year, we're embarking on a very special mission... we're targeting litter and what every Township resident can do to reduce litter which will result in an even better... "BEST TOWN AROUND."

We are also proud to report that the Woodbridge Township Department of Public Works and the Office of Recycling continues their day-to-day work providing outstanding service to all of our residents. In fact, it's important to note that last year, the Office of Recycling earned \$261,930.05 from the New Jersey Recycling Tonnage Grant which is based on the amount/tonnage of materials collected and recycled along with \$203,120.84 from the New Jersey Clean Communities Grant. The grant funding allowed for the expansion of the ReUse It Center at the Public Works facility in Keasbey and to further expand our recycling efforts to include the recycling of Styrofoam, cooking oil(s), and plastic bags, film and shrink-wrap. Throughout the year the Department of Public Works will continue to implement many more sustainable initiatives and programs that serve to better manage the ways we offer sanitation services, conserve energy and other natural resources at work and home.

The Recycle Coach APP again accompanies the 2024 calendar. We made a number of improvements that make the APP easier to navigate as well as simplifies trash, recycling and special collection information – all right at your fingertips!!! Search the database for specific recycling instructions. Keep track of upcoming special collection events, household hazardous waste drop-off, confidential document shredding day, Christmas tree collection, bagged leaf collection and more. Report a waste problem or send comments and suggestions through the APP.

Once again, we're anxiously looking forward to hosting the Township-wide yard sale weekend this spring...

Remember, the annual Yard Sale weekend is a great way to Reduce, Reuse & Recycle! Please note that there is NO curbside bulk waste collection following the yard sales. Bulk waste collection must be scheduled by calling the sanitation office at 732-738-1311 x3600.

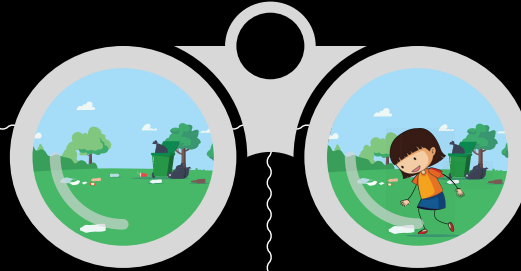

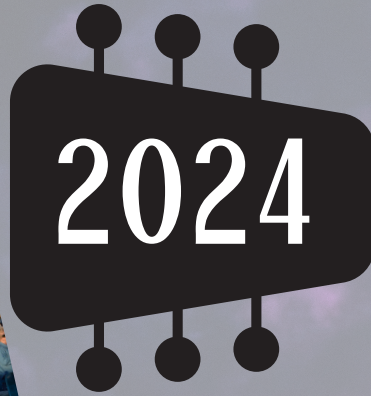

Let's learn about Cigarette butts...

Smokers can easily dispose of their cigarette butts in an appropriate receptacle, instead of tossing them out of a car window or dropping them on the ground. The problem is, most smokers do not think of tossing or dropping a butt as littering, but it is! Cigarette butts account for 32% of all litter, and they are the number one littered item. Found on our sidewalks and streets, they end up in our storm drains, flowing to our streams, rivers, bays and ultimately the ocean. Littered cigarette butts leach chemicals such as arsenic and lead into the environment and can contaminate water. This can poison fish as well as animals that eat them. *Don't flick that butt, it's litter!*



Where to Place Your Curbside Cart



*Check your calendar to make sure it is your collection day. ***DO NOT** place any items next to the cart, only items in the cart will be collected.

*Place your cart at the curb after 4 P.M. the day before your collection day.

* **DO NOT** bag recyclables.

*Remove your cart from the curb by 9 P.M. the day of your collection. ***No** bulk trash unless you called sanitation for a pick up.

*Carts must be stored in your side or rear yard.

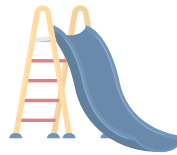

Learn about Balloons... What goes up.....must come down!

When we release balloons into the air, we forget that they will eventually deflate and end up in trees, on the ground, in streams, rivers and the ocean. Balloons are considered to be airborne litter! Birds, turtles and other animals can mistake balloons for food, eat them and become sick or die. Animals can become entangled in the strings from balloons injuring or even killing them. Discover how chewing gum can become a sticky situation....

After cigarettes, chewing gum is the most littered item. Most gums are made from Polymers which is a synthetic plastic and is not biodegradable. Humans and animals cannot digest it. It can make its way into the food chain accumulating toxins as it goes. It can take hundreds of years to break down and decompose. Chewing gum doesn't just pollute the environment, it is also costly to remove. It can cost between seventy five cents to a dollar fifty a square foot for removal. *Don't litter, put it in the trash!*



Litter Free Waterways







During and following rainfall, stormwater carries accumulated leaves and litter from streets and sidewalks into storm drains, leading to two significant concerns:

1. **Residential Flooding:** The accumulation of leaves and litter can obstruct storm drains, stopping proper water drainage, which can result in flooding streets and properties.
2. **Poor Water Quality:** As water travels through piles of leaves, phosphorus rapidly leaches out, leading to phosphorus-enriched water flowing into our waterways. This contributes to algae blooms, causing the water to turn green and emit unpleasant odors, while simultaneously reducing oxygen levels. This negatively impacts the plants and wildlife dependent on this water. Similarly, litter breaking down in the water releases harmful contaminants, which also can have adverse effects.

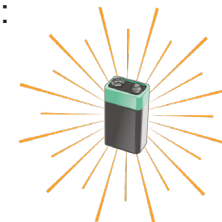
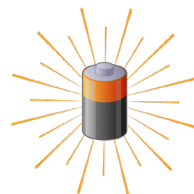

Wishcycling!

The act of placing items in the recycling bin, hoping they will be recycled!

Wishcycling is problematic for several reasons:

1. Contamination of Recycling Stream: When non-recyclable items are placed in recycling bins, it contaminates the recycling stream. Contamination makes it challenging to effectively process and sort recyclables, reducing the overall quality of recycled materials.
2. Increased Costs: Sorting out non-recyclable items from the recycling stream requires additional labor and resources. This increases the cost of recycling processes, which may ultimately impact recycling programs and their sustainability.



Environmental Impact: Wishcycling can result in recyclables being improperly handled or disposed of, leading to environmental harm. For instance, items that are not suitable for recycling may end up in landfills or incinerators, contributing to pollution and resource depletion.

Disruption of Recycling Facilities: Wishcycling can cause damage to recycling equipment and machinery. Items that are not designed for recycling may jam or damage sorting machinery in recycling facilities, leading to downtime, repairs, and increased maintenance costs.

Simple actions such as recycling, picking up litter, and spreading awareness about the importance of a clean environment can help reduce litter. 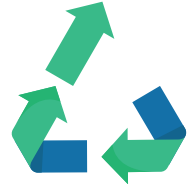

Snow Plowing



Throughout the winter months, prioritizing the safety of Woodbridge Township residents remains a paramount focus for the Department of Public Works.



As a standard procedure, arterial and primary roads take precedence in the plowing and salting efforts. Following the clearance of these key routes, attention is then directed to all other roads.

Residents can contribute to the effectiveness of our snow removal operations by:

1. Clearing all vehicles from streets when snow is anticipated until plowing is finished.
2. Avoiding the shoveling of snow into the street.
3. Being mindful that when the plow passes, snow will accumulate on your driveway apron; refrain from shoveling until plowing operations conclude.
4. Prioritizing safety by refraining from driving unless absolutely necessary during adverse weather conditions.

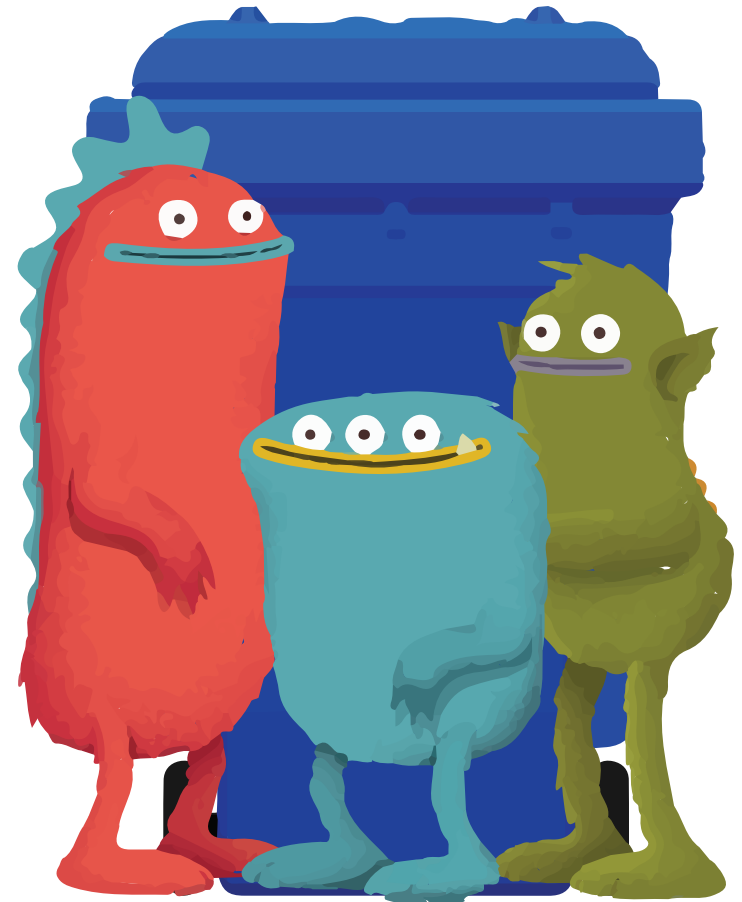

Know Your Flood Hazard: Protect Yourself and Your Property from Flooding

Protect Our Natural Floodplains

Only rain goes down the storm drain. The ability for storm drain systems to function correctly directly relates to minimizing flood inundation, potential damage sustained during strong rain events, and the reduction of non-point source pollution into our waterways. Know Your Flood Hazard

Woodbridge Township has areas of special flood hazards located in the AE, A, Coastal A, and VE zones. You can locate Special Flood Hazard Areas in your neighborhood by looking at the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) at FEMA's Map Service Center or on the Township's floodplain management website, via the Woodbridge Township Interactive Flood Viewer which shows both the 2010 Effective FIRM and 2014 Preliminary FIRM, or by visiting our FEMA Flood Zones link on the Township's floodplain management webpage. Woodbridge Township contains areas of tidal and fluvial flooding. Never drive down flooded roadways. For your safety, our web pages have links to real-time tide gauge data. The Township of Woodbridge participates in the Middlesex County Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan is designed to help identify local weaknesses and assess ways to potentially combat those issues. Thus, the overall outcome of the plan's development is to reduce devastating effects of future storm events and other natural hazards. The plan is available to view on the Township's floodplain management website. Please note that the Woodbridge Township Flood Viewer should only be used as a reference. For further flood zone clarification or to request a free flood zone designation letter for your property, please contact Thomas C. Flynn, M.P.A., CFM in the Woodbridge Township Division of Engineering.

Protect Yourself/Property from Flood Hazards

This information has been developed to help minimize risk within floodplains, and in order to reduce the amount of flood damage sustained during future flood events. Some areas of Woodbridge Township have been historically susceptible to flooding, and as a result it's important to know how to prepare for, respond to, and recover from a potential flood event. Build Responsibly

If you are in the market to potentially purchase property, you should examine any possibility of a flood hazard BEFORE YOU BUY & BEFORE YOU BUILD, and the need to have flood insurance to protect yourselves and your property. Historic flood risk may not be the same risk you face today or in the future. By rebuilding higher or to a more resilient standard, you can reduce-or avoid- future flood loss and reduce the impact on your finances. The Township recognizes The New Jersey State Flood Hazard Area (FHA) Control Act Rules, N.J.A.C. 7:13. Please note that in situations where the base flood elevation (BFE) denotes a more protective delineation, the State of New Jersey is using the information as the basis for statewide floodplain development standards. To learn more about the types of N.J. Flood Hazard Area Permit Authorizations, visit our Floodplain Management website and to view the Township's Municipal Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance, including Chapter 22 of the General Ordinance and the Township's Open Space Conservation & Resilience Zone Ordinance (OSC/R Zone).

Carry Flood Insurance

Federal law requires that a Flood Insurance Policy be obtained as a condition of a federally backed mortgage or loan that is secured by the structure located in an area of special flood hazard, as per the Effective Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) delineation. Although some areas susceptible to flood risk do not require the purchase of flood insurance, it is recommended in order to best minimize financial vulnerability during a potential flood event. It's important to carry flood insurance even if you are not federally required to do so. According to FEMA, a structure located in a Special Flood Hazard Area has a 26% annual chance of experiencing a 1% annual exceedance probability flood (100-year flood event) over the course of a 30 year mortgage. A property not in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) may be damaged by a flood greater than that predicted on a flood study, such as a FIRM or state delineation. According to FEMA nearly 25% of all National Flood Insurance Program flood insurance claims come from policy holders outside of federally mapped Special Flood Hazard Areas. Learn more about how the Township's FEMA Community Rating System Program can help to potentially reduce your flood insurance premiums through the NFIP, even for structures mapped outside the SFHA.

FEMA COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Woodbridge Township Division of Engineering, in conjunction with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), implements the Community Rating System. For detailed FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) determinations based on a street address which delineate floodways, limits of wave action, state protected natural areas, NOAA sea-level-rise data, historical extents of flood inundation, and flood depths contact the Woodbridge Township Division of Engineering for assistance: 732-602-6057. In addition, the Township offers flood protection assistance information in order to help property owners reduce vulnerability from flood related hazards. Flood-proofing techniques vary in size, scale and scope in relation to specific flood hazard conditions and the use of the structure. Some retrofitting alternatives might include elevating the structure, constructing engineered flood walls and protecting utilities from flood vulnerability. This service is intended to help provide one-on-one assistance to property owners in order to evaluate potential flood protection options. This service is not intended to function as means by which to offer design, engineering, or construction project support. Interested parties should contact the Division of Engineering in order to arrange for a consultation. Be sure to obtain all necessary permits before construction. NOTE: Consultation is based on the available "Flood Insurance Rate Maps(s)" of the municipality. This consultation does not imply that the referenced property will or will not be free from flooding or damage. A property may be damaged by a flood greater than that predicted on the FIRM or from a local drainage problem not shown on the map. This consultation does not create liability on the part of the municipality, or any officer, or employee thereof, for any damage that results from reliance on consultation determinations.

Tips to be better prepared for potential flooding events

- *Be aware of alternative evacuation routes from your neighborhood.
- *Gather supplies that you might need during a flood event, such as: a "go-bag" battery-powered radio, emergency kit, etc.
- *Plan for how you will care for your pets.
- *Create a plan. Visit www.redcross.org to learn more about developing ways to be better prepared.
- *Avoid downed power lines that could pose a serious life-threatening hazard. Report these issues to utility companies immediately.
- *The Township conducts stream channel inspections annually and in relation to strong storm events. If you have a conveyance concern, you may call the Division of Engineering at: 732.602.6057.
- *Generators should never be operated inside your home or garage.



Steer Clear of Flooded Roads

- *Never drive on flooded roads - almost half of flood deaths happen in vehicles
- *6 inches of water is enough to cause you to lose control of your vehicle
- *If you encounter flood waters on a roadway Turn Around, Don't Drown.

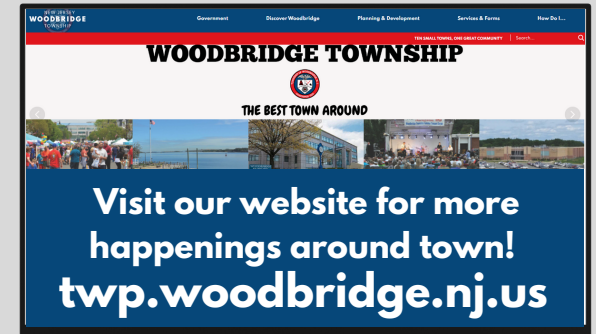

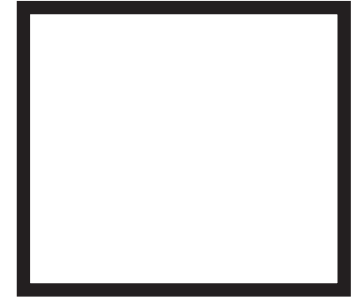
