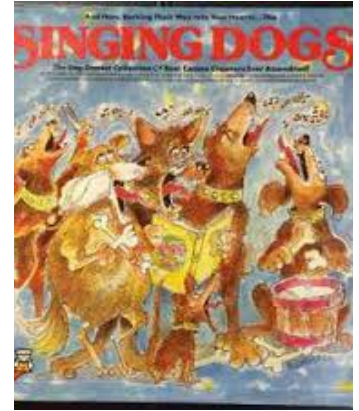
Arf! The Musical

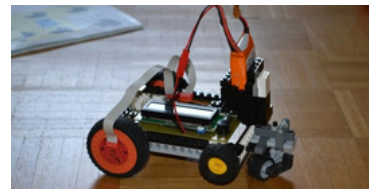

Aerospace Explorers

As NASA continues the Artemis II missions to return humanity to the Moon, the next generation of aerospace engineers is already hard at work. In Aerospace Explorers, campers step into the role of rocket designers, applying real NASA inspired engineering principles to design, prototype, and launch their own rockets. Throughout the week students will study the fundamentals of thrust, life, drag, and stability, learn to read and create precise technical drawings, use accurate measurements to design aerodynamic rockets, prototype with straw rockets to test flight performance, analyze and refine designs and scale their models into full sized water bottle rockets. Using the engineering design process, campers will test, revise, and improve their rockets just like real aerospace teams preparing for launch. Storybook Builders

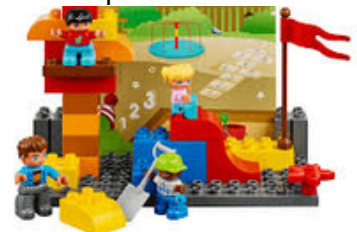

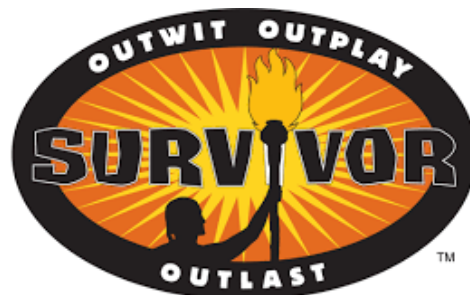

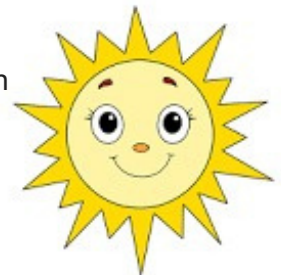
