## Ecology Walk: July 14 @ 10:00 AM

(rain date July 15)

The Oros Wildlife Preserve contains ponds, wetlands, forest, fields, and a butterfly garden, which provide habitat for a myriad of plant and wildlife species. Come explore the Preserve and learn about the diversity of life living right in the middle of a highly—urbanized landscape!

## Bat Walk: August 11 @ 7:30 PM

(rain date August 12th)

Nine species of bats call New Jersey home... and many can be seen flying around the neighborhood at dusk. Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve as the light fades to watch bats hunt insects using echolocation, and learn about their unique ecology! You will learn how to use an acoustic monitor that can detect what bat species are flying nearby.

## Bird Walk: August 25 @ 8:00 AM

(rain date August 26)

Come to the Oros Wildlife Preserve for a guided bird walk to see (and hear) birds in a variety of habitats. The preserve is a birding hot spot, with over 160 species reported on [ebird.com](http://ebird.com). Birders of all levels are welcome and encouraged to attend! Binoculars will be provided.
